Animal Diversity in the Cloud Forest: Student Assessment

If your animal were to be featured on the *Canopy in the Clouds* site, what would you want people to learn about it?

Step 1: Navigate through the *Canopy in the Clouds* site to find a location where your animal would live. First, select an appropriate panorama. Then within that panorama, decide whether your animal is more likely to be found on the ground or in the canopy. Within the area that makes the most sense to you, choose a particular location for the text box link to be located. Be as specific as you can in describing the best location for the link, and include a short explanation of your choice.

For example:

My animal text box should be in Panorama 3 (high elevation forest). The link should go up in the canopy. This animal is often found in the crook of a tree, so the link should be placed just above hotlink #5.
